- 1 Heard Mr. Raja Thakre, learned senior counsel appearing for Applicant.
- By this application, the applicant seeks to challenge the order dated 12/02/2021 passed by Learned ACMM, 4th Court, Girgaon, Mumbai in Application No.03/SW/2021 holding that Ludo is not a Game of Chance but a Game of Skill, and that it requires skill to win the said game.
- 3 Learned senior counsel appearing for Applicant submits that the order is erroneous inasmuch as Ludo is a Game of Chance and not a Game of

Skill and that the provisions of the Maharashtra Prevention of the Gambling Act, 1887 shall apply if the said game is played for stake.

- 4 Having heard, learned senior counsel for Applicant, we direct issuance of notice to the Respondent, returnable on 22/06/2021.
